Jungle Trail



One of the most popular activities on site is our adventure course set within the woods. There are over 15 obstacles to climb, balance, swing, slide and get tangled up on, making this a great challenge for any age. Just be prepared to get a bit muddy! The Jungle trail is excellent to be used for team challenges, time trials and races. Due to its higher maintenance and the odd tree falling, the course is constantly changing and new obstacles are added on occasion.

Age: Any age

Group size: No limit

Clothing: Suitable clothing to get muddy

Location: Behind the campfire circle

Safety: Limit the number of participants on any obstacle and provide leader supervision on the large obstacles for the younger participants. You must risk assess and document this activity yourself before using as it does depend on the capability of your young people to safely complete the course.

Instructors: This activity is self-run by the groups own leaders. It is recommended that you use at least three leaders to supervise the activity, but this will of course depend on the age of the participants.

The information below is provided to assist the groups' responsible leaders in the preparation of their own documented Risk Assessment</p> <p>Our risk assessment cannot take in to account the competence of the supervision nor the ability, medical condition or attitude of the participants.</p> <p>It is expected that the factors below will be considered by the groups' responsible leader when completing their own documented Risk Assessment before and during use of the activity</p>		
Slip/ trip when running on the course	All participants must wear sensible footwear, and leaders must check the course immediately before it is used by their group to assess the ground conditions for muddy patches, objects on the ground etc.	Participants,	
Slips from an Obstacle	The obstacles need to be checked prior to use by the responsible group leader to ensure that they are free of mud and if wet the condition is still suitable for use. Obstacles which are unsuitable for use should not be used until condition improve.	Participants	
Failure of the structure of an obstacle	The obstacles on the course are inspected each weekend and the results of the inspection recorded in the site safety file.	Participant	
Wood splinter	Monthly inspections – Gloves have been considered but not thought necessary	Participant	
Fall from obstacle	It is possible to fall off any of the obstacles by the nature of the activity there is some risk involved – obstacles must be supervised by Leaders/ Young Leaders to help participants	Participant	
Third Party Injury	The Jungle trail has a scramble net, approx. 3m high. Notices are posted to advise people not to use the course without supervision. Leaders are informed of this upon arrival and need to ensure this is implemented.	Members of the Public, Campers	
Damage to fences and obstacles	All fences and obstacles are regularly inspected by staff for damage, and to ensure all obstacles are safe for use.	Members of the Public, Campers	

Covid-19 Transmission of infection	If a member of the group become unwell with suspected Covid symptoms, they are to be removed by isolation and managed by the group, awaiting collection from site. If a member of the staff become unwell with suspected Covid symptoms, they are to remove themselves and leave site promptly	Everyone	
Covid-19	Hand sanitiser to be used before start of session. Hands to be washed after session and sanitiser to be used again.	Participants
